




Group Visits to Church Gardens

Garden Tours

With Kay McHugh



Our Garden Tours offer visitors a truly enjoyable day out to Church Gardens. The Tour will bed led by the owner and gardener, Kay McHugh, who will share her personal insight into this ongoing restoration project.

If your group are visiting for the first time, we recommend booking the Introductory Guided Tour where you will explore all of the main garden features. For returning groups of visitors, we're introducing a series of subject specific Garden Tours where Kay will focus on a particular subject of interest.

All group visits will begin with a short talk in the Arcadia Tea Room followed by a walk in the gardens lasting approximately 45 minutes.

Garden Tours



1. Introductory Guided Tour to Church Gardens


With almost 3 acres of gardens to explore, booking a guided tour ensures you don't miss a thing! Visitors will find out about the history, restoration and upkeep of this inspiring project. The tour includes all garden features and is recommend for all groups visiting the garden for the first time.

2. Organic Fruit and Vegetable Growing

Kay shares her secrets for producing a successful harvest. With over 30 years experience of growing fruit and vegetables, Kay will explain her approach to gardening which is centered around key organic principles such as; companion planting, soil enrichment & improving biodiversity.



Best time to book: August-October

3. Creating a Food Forest in Your Garden

Kay will explain the principles behind forest gardening and talk about the unusual edible and medicinal plants that feature in the Forest Garden at Church Gardens. Kay will discuss why this type of sustainable gardening is so relevant to gardeners today.



Best time to book: June-October

4. Permaculture and Sustainability in the Garden

Kay explains how Church Gardens has been designed using permaculture principles to be high yielding, regenerative and sustainable. Kay will discuss examples of creative recycling within the garden and explain how we use natural resources within our composting, leaf mould and rain water harvesting systems.

5. A Historically Sensitive Garden Restoration

Kay will discuss the research into the historical background of Church Gardens and how she and Patrick then devised an appropriate design for the kitchen gardens that is sympathetic to its origins but suitable for the needs and available labour of the present day.

6. Explore Church Gardens

Kay will give the group an update on new features in the garden and all visitors will be given a map of the grounds. The group have private access to the gardens and can explore the grounds at their own pace. Kay will be available to answer visitor's questions.



1. Church Gardens: A Family's Restoration Journey

Kay will give an illustrated talk about her family's 25 year journey to restore and rebuild their 17th Century house and 3-acre walled garden. The talk will include a brief reference to the historical research about the property, the hard initial stages of rebuilding a home for a young family, creating a productive garden to feed that family, and finally, attempting to restore the garden to its former glory for the public to enjoy.

2. Church Gardens: Going Public



During this illustrated talk, Kay looks back at our first year of opening the gardens to the public, before Covid-19 spread across the globe. Church Gardens then became a safe haven where the family isolated together for over a year. This time not only proved to be extremely productive, but life changing. 3. A Year at Church Gardens

Although the gardens are only open to the public for half the year, looking after Church Gardens is a fulltime job. This talk gives a personal insight into what is involved for the McHugh family who maintain the gardens through the seasons whilst also continuing to put into action their plan to complete the restoration, create new garden features and open the garden more regularly to the public.

Car


If travelling to Church Gardens by car, please be aware that Sat-Navs will guide you close to Church Gardens but they are not always entirely accurate. The postcode UB96DU should guide you to Church Hill Road. The turning to Church Gardens is marked by a sign for Church Gardens and this entrance road is also shared with St Mary's Parish Church. Turn right at the bottom of the hill, following the walled lane past the St Mary's Parish Church Graveyard.

Parking

Parking is available for visitors at the bottom of the driveway on the grass verge. Three parking spaces closer to the garden entrance can be arranged for easy access if organised in advance, please notify us if this is required when making your booking.

Public Transport

Bus – The 331 & U9 buses stop at St Mary's Road. It is a 7 minute walk to Church Gardens.

Yes, there is a fully accessible disabled toilet in the Arcadia Tea Room.

Are the Gardens accessible for wheelchairs?

There are a variety of surfaces within the grounds, including uneven ground, gravel, grass and paved pathways. If you have any concerns, please talk to a member of our team ahead of your visit.

Are dogs allowed?

During group visits, only assistance dogs are allowed into the gardens.

Do you cater for specific dietary needs?

Yes, we can cater for specific dietary requirements if it is arranged in advance of your visit.
